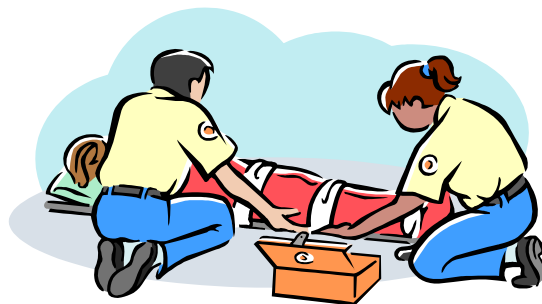

## General Information

Troop 103 is hosting this year's fall Camporee. The Camporee is open to Webelos, Troops, and Crews. The Camporee will be held at Camp Conewago September 30<sup>th</sup>, October 1<sup>st</sup>, & October 2<sup>nd</sup>.

**Please Note: Webelos may camp for the weekend or attend just Saturday. Webelos who are staying overnight must be attended by a parent or guardian.**

**Theme:** The theme for the fall Camporee is First Aid and Emergency Preparedness. Activities will be centered on training and education relating to first aid and emergency preparedness. Merit badges will not be offered.

**Registration:** The registration fee is \$6.00 per Scout, Scouter or any other adult wishing to take part in the Camporee (an \$8.00 late fee will be assessed for registrations received after 9/12/2011). Make checks payable to "New Birth of Freedom Council". Registration fees are non-refundable. Registration forms are included with this brochure. This fee includes program supplies, awards, and an event patch. (Lunch is **not** included at this event.)

Please have only one adult check in to complete registration and turn in your unit roster. Changes in registrations and corrections will be handled at that time. Everyone participating in activities must be registered. Tour permits are not required for district events.

**Camping and parking:** Regrettably, due to the limited space available for camping and parking, campsites and parking will be assigned by the event committee. Campsites may be assigned on the large open field in the center of camp. Trailers are to be parked adjacent to the camp. Absolutely no trailers of any kind are to be parked in campsites. (Accommodations will be considered for anyone who has special needs in regards to the use of their vehicle.)

**Traffic flow:** All incoming traffic to Conewago will use Boy Scout Lane off of Dick's Dam Road. All outgoing traffic will use the Bosserman family farm lane that will be available for this event only. The lane will be adequately marked. Please respect the private property you will be traveling

on as you use the lane. Be aware of the Outdoor Code and Leave No Trace Principles. All trash must be carried out by each unit.

**Uniforms:** Please honor the Scout uniform. The official BSA field uniform (class “A”) should be worn for church services, and the campfire after the church services. On Saturday, units may “show their colors” by wearing their troop unit t-shirts and/or hats.

**Friday Night Leader Meeting:** Please make sure that your unit is represented at all leader meetings. Troops and Crews should have their Senior Patrol Leader/Crew President attend as well. The meeting will be located at the main lodge. Last minute updates, changes, and complete details will be reviewed at each meeting.

**Church Services:** A Scout is Reverent. Both a Catholic and a non-denominational worship service will be offered Saturday evening at approximately 7pm. Please encourage all scouts and scouters to attend the service of their choice. Reminder: the official BSA field uniform (class “A”) should be worn for church services.

**Check out:** No unit may depart until their campsite has been inspected and approved by a staff member. Patches and ribbons will be presented after your site has been checked and event evaluation forms turned in. Sites must be properly cleared and should be in better condition than when the unit arrived. Pay particular attention to making sure you do not leave metal tent spikes behind. They do damage to the mowers.

**Staff Opportunities:** There are limited staff opportunities available for adults.

## **Health and Safety**

**First Aid:** First Aid will be available during the Camporee. Units may take care of minor injuries such as scrapes and splinters. All situations requiring first aid attention must be reported to the first aid officer. Units are

responsible for maintaining current BSA Class 1 Personal Health and Medical History forms for each member. The unit leader will need to have a current medical form for every person attending the Camporee.

**Vehicles:** All vehicles and trailers are to be parked in the designated parking areas after unloading. Trailers will be unloaded and then parked adjacent to camp. Due to significant space restrictions, recreation vehicles will not be allowed for this event.

**Trash:** Units are responsible for removing trash, disposable and recyclable items, from campsites. Wood ash and charcoal should be removed to the ash pit north of the parking area behind the main lodge.

**Water:** Each unit should bring their own water. Water will be available for refilling at the pump behind the main lodge.

**Safety:** Unit leaders and scouters are responsible for the safety of all Scouts in their care. No flames of any kind are allowed in tents. Folding knives less than 4" long may be worn in a case on a belt or kept in a pocket. Sheath knives are not allowed and will not be tolerated. Remind Scouts to bring their Tote-N-Chip cards. Electronics are not encouraged. Alcoholic beverages and controlled substances of any kind are not allowed.

Note: be aware that there is poison ivy growing within the wooded areas and efforts should be made to avoid those areas.

**Campfires:** There will be some firewood available. The camp Conewago committee is requesting that you do not bring wood in from other sources. Controlled campfires will be allowed in the campsites within the designated campsite areas. All units should provide their own equipment for above-ground fires. Units assigned a campsite with a permanent fire ring may use it but all other campfires must be above ground. Propane appliances are acceptable under adult supervision. All spare fuel containers are to be stored in a safe location and taken home. Under no circumstances are trees to be felled. Large bonfires are not allowed in campsites.

**Discipline:** Leaders are responsible for the behavior of their Scouts and for providing sufficient adult leaders so Scouts are supervised at all times. If a situation warrants, individuals will be asked to leave the premises.

**Pets or Animals:** Other than working or service animals, no animals or pets are permitted in camp.
