	\$22/person for Indian Echo Caverns if age 12+; or
	\$13/person for Indian Echo Caverns if age 2-11.
	Sack dinner for Friday night (or eat first) – remember our nut & other allergies
	Flashlight (headlamp preferred), extra batteries
	Personal First Aid Kit
	Sleeping Bag with Liner (consider 2 sleeping bags or fleece/blankets)
	Gloves/Mittens, Hand Warmers, Coat, Hat. Raingear if rain is forecast.
	Suitable Clothes (BE PREPARED! check the weather forecast.
	Dress in layers. Consider long johns & long sleeve shirts, ski pants/bib
	Changes of Clothes, INCLUDING SOCKS
	Proper footwear & socks – boots if snow;
	Closed-toe shoes required for the cavern; hiking boots for afternoon.
	Class B Uniform - Wear it for travel on Friday & Sunday
	Daypack
	Water bottle with water
	Camp/Folding chair
	Mess Kit
	Toothbrush & toothpaste
	Map & Compass
	Sun Protection
	Whistle (for emergencies)
	Pocket Knife (if earned Totin' Chip)
	Matches & Fire-Starters (if earned Firem'n Chit)
	BSA Handbook
